- ☐ It helps teachers guide children to books that are at their individual reading levels.
- Children take short quizzes after reading a book to check if they've understood it. This can be done at home and at school with their username and password.


Why have we used Accelerated Reader for the past <u>nine</u> years?

Improved reading ages at individual and class level.
Motivates all pupils, particularly boys, to read more often and encourage reading for pleasure.
League tables and striving to become a word millionaire adds to the competitive edge, which supports pupils to engage with the program.
AR quizzes have helped staff/pupils massively, as well as parents, to ascertain how well your child has understood a particular book.
Parental feedback has been very positive over the years since its introduction. Some have said that AR had completely turned their child's reading in a positive way.
Parents can see the progress of their child's reading- success in quizzes and when they are taking them with their own login (access details to follow).
More recently, the opportunity to do non-fiction based reading with the articles has engaged pupils a lot more.




This is what you see if you click on <u>one</u> of their quizzes in their record....




Their ZPD book level.

Recommended ReadS in KS2



Are you a parent? If your school makes the Get Email Updates link available at the top of the page, you can select it and choose to receive emails whenever your child takes Accelerated Reader quizzes or Star tests. You can also see your child's Star scores on the My Targets tab. To look up books that have Accelerated Reader quizzes, go to https://www.arbookfind.co.uk (UK) or https://www.arbookfind.com.au (Australia).

FAQ

1) Why does my child have a book which seems significantly easier than ones they have been reading?

Your child is likely to have completed their star reader and it has registered them as having a ZPD range to access in the library. The idea is that they start from near to the lower number in their ZPD and work their way up to the higher end and beyond. If they are having success with that first book, then there is no reason why they cannot motor up to those higher numbers and stretch themselves. Remember, it is how they comprehend what they are reading and not the individual words and the ability to read them. Their first book should be towards the bottom end of their ZPD to get starting on the program.

2) Why can't my child do a quiz on their book?

This is likely to be because the book is not linked to an Accelerated Reader quiz. There are many titles that are but some pupils will be disappointed when it is not on there. It can be requested to AR but it is not instant!

3) What is a ZPD? How are they worked out?

The Zone of Proximal Development gives us an idea where their reading lies between two different parameters. It is worked out when they do their online star reading test and the test adapts to their answers to questions.

4) Why are they not passing quizzes?

This is because pupils have either; rushed the quiz, rushed finishing the book, not finished the book or quizzed on something they read ages ago. Be mindful that what they are reading is not below their ZPD- this would be a backward step!

5) Can they read home books?

We allow pupils to read books from home, particularly if they have a wide range at home or they can't find one in the library. If this is above their ZPD range, we encourage them to read it but would ask them to ensure it is pitched at the right level and they can cope with it. The proof would be in how they get on with the quiz and their success.

As a parent, how can you help?

- 1. Register your email for updates on their login.
- 2. Challenge them if no updates have been given.
- 3. Access their overview of reading- have a discussion about the books and what they enjoyed. Discuss their scores.
- 4. Listen to them read (where possible)- is the book pitched at the right level for them?
- 5. Listen to them read (where possible)- ask some questions to test their retrieval and inference skills.
- 6. Set some challenges of pages to get to by a certain time.
- 7. When they log in to AR, check that they have finished the book before quizzing. Always quiz within 48 hours of finishing a book.
- 8. Encourage them to read articles as well as books.
- 9. Encourage the use of quizzing at home.
- 10. Encourage them to use AR Book Finder.
- 11. Set them mini challenges of meaning tasks, new vocabulary or summarising information, etc.
