- An online reading program linked to our school library that monitors reading practice and progress (individually and group based) across Years 5-8.
- It helps teachers guide children to books that are at their individual reading levels.
- Children take short quizzes after reading a book to check if they've understood it. This can be done at home and at school with their username and password.
- We have a unique school website address for AR, which is in your child's planner (page 3).


Why have we used Accelerated Reader for the past <u>seven</u> years?


This is what you see if you click on <u>one</u> of their quizzes in their record....



For Parents and Guardians

- 1. Register your email for updates on their login.
- 2. Challenge them if no updates have been given.
- 3. Access their overview of reading- have a discussion about the books and what they enjoyed. Discuss their scores.
- 4. Listen to them read (where possible)- is the book pitched at the right level for them?
- 5. Listen to them read (where possible)- ask some questions to test their retrieval and inference skills.
- 6. Set some challenges of pages to get to by a certain time.
- 7. When they log in to AR, check that they have finished the book before quizzing. Always quiz within 48 hours of finishing a book.
- 8. Encourage them to read articles as well as books.
- 9. Encourage the use of quizzing at home.
- 10. Encourage them to use AR Book Finder.
- 11. Set them mini challenges of meaning tasks, new vocabulary or summarising information, etc.
