Annual School Report 2022

As the end of the academic year draws to a close, I am writing to inform you that your child's annual school reports will be available to view by logging into your Go4schools account.

This report will contain comments from subject teachers and an indication of attainment. Pupils' end of year achievement is given in terms of age-related expectations (i.e. whether they are 'Developing' towards, 'Meeting' or 'Exceeding' the expected achievement for their age).

Please log into the desktop version of Go4schools to access your child's report where you can scroll down and click the 'View report' link. You can then also download, save as a PDF and print copies of the report.

For Year 6 pupils, there will also be report of their **SATs Results**. We are very proud of how far our pupils have come in the two years since joining us but it is important to remember that at our school, SATs results are the 'half-time' scores. We apologise for the complexity of the grades for these national assessments – the system is not ours. The results are explained on the report and I have also attached a key at the end of this letter for your convenience.

SAT's Assessments Key

For results based on a SATs Test (English Reading and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) and Maths):

- Each child is given a scaled score as a number. This is based on their raw score – the number of marks they receive in a test.
- Children may achieve a score of:
 - Below 100, meaning they have not met the 'expected standard'
 - 100, meaning they have reached the 'expected standard'
 - Above 100, meaning they have exceeded the 'expected standard'
- For children in year 6 taking the KS2 tests, scores range from 80 to 120.
- A child who reaches the expected standard (100 or above) is considered to be ready for the next stage of their education.

For teacher assessments in English Writing results are in the following form:

WTS Working towards the expected standard

EXS Working at the expected standard

GDS Working at greater depth (well above the expected standard)

PK6 Pre-key stage standards, for pupils working below the standard of the National Curriculum Assessments

For teacher assessments in Science results are in the following form:

HNM Has not met the expected standard

EXS Working at the expected standard

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
